

Professor Dr. Erich Saling

"Father of Perinatal Medicine"

Professor Erich Saling is a significant pathfinder of the medical field "Perinatal Medicine" which cares for infants before, during, and after birth as well as for mothers.

Professor Dr. Erich Saling, one of the best known pioneers in the field of perinatal medicine was born on July 21st, 1925 in Stanislau (Ukraine, formerly Poland). Since 1952 he is married to Dr. Hella Saling and has two sons as well as six grandchildren.

In 1960 Professor Saling performed the first direct examination of the unborn child, the "fetal micro blood analysis", opening the door to prenatal medicine.

He is also the founder of the first national Society, as well as the first international, Association of Perinatal Medicine. His significant contributions led to the expansion of this specialty. Therefore, the international community of colleagues calls him the "Father of Perinatal Medicine".

In 1988 the Berlin Senate distinguished Professor Saling by awarding him the Ernst-Reuter medal for his services. In 2001 he was decorated with the Order of the Federal Republic of Germany (1st class) by the President of the German Republic, Johannes Rau. In 2000 the "World Association of Perinatal Medicine" established an award named after Professor Saling as a special honor. This award is given every two years to the best scientist in the field of Perinatal Medicine. In May 2005 Prof. Saling has been elected as president of the new founded "International Academy of Perinatal Medicine".

Since 1967, Prof. Saling was the Director of the Institute of Perinatal Medicine of the Free University of Berlin and the Director of the Department of Obstetrics in the community Hospital Berlin Neukoelln (Germany). Under his leadership over 60 000 children were born. In order to be able to continue his work to improve the health of mother and child he founded the non-profit "Erich Saling-Institute of Perinatal Medicine". Even after "retirement" he thus developed one of his best achievements: The Self-Care-Program for pregnant women for prevention of prematurity.

Professor Saling published over 550 scientific contributions in the field of obstetrics and perinatal medicine,

Starting from the year 1963 he organized one-week courses in the field of obstetrics and perinatal medicine for physicians from all over the world. So far 64 courses took place with more than 2500 participants from 45 countries.

1967 He introduced the term "Perinatal Medicine" into literature which is a widespread common designation today.



1967 He established the first national society of perinatal medicine, the German Society of Perinatal Medicine in Berlin. In 1968 he founded the first international society for Perinatal Medicine, the European Association of Perinatal Medicine; of which he was the first president.

1973 Establishment of the first international journal in the field of Perinatal Medicine, the "Journal of Perinatal Medicine".

1990 Establishment of the German Society of Prenatal and Obstetrical Medicine.
